After trying to make things work, I have had to accept that Viper needs something I cannot provide in our current home: the chance to be the only animal. She does not get along with other cats or dogs, and living with them causes her too much stress.

Viper is being adopted through PIF because I want to ensure that she finds the right home—one where her needs are understood and she can finally feel peaceful, secure, and happy.
